A quick search of the internet (including Elections Alberta www.elections.ab.ca) will provide you with information on all of the political parties vying for your vote. Individual sites will have their platform, or what the party will do as the next government. Read what they offer, think about this information and consider if it aligns with your own thoughts and values. Discuss what you think and feel with your family and friends. Speak to the candidate in your riding. Ask them your questions --weigh their answers with your own thoughts. These are the people who should be taking your concerns and feelings most seriously.

The single most important action you can take is to VOTE.

In 2019, the last provincial election, 32.5% of eligible Alberta voters did not vote. Not caring about a process that determines so much of one's life is disheartening. Believe it or not, whether you care or not, politicians have more to do with your life day-to-day than you realize.

Local or municipal governments, mayors, reeves and councilors determine property taxes and what you will be paying for water, sewer and garbage collection to whether your town will build a park or apartment building on a vacant piece of land to what YOU can build on your own land.

Federal governments have jurisdiction over how much income tax you pay, how many RCMP officers are assigned to your area, how much you pay to mail a letter or a parcel and how much of our equalization money we might see (Spoiler Alert! It isn't much).

The provincial government allots funds for schools, hospitals, care facilities, roads and other vital infrastructure. The provincial government determines how much a speeding ticket will cost and some court matters. They also decide how they will behave in a disaster situations such as fires, floods or pandemics.

Every single vote counts. Voting is a right and a privilege that many individuals in the world do not have. Elections have been won and lost on a single vote. Is that your vote?
